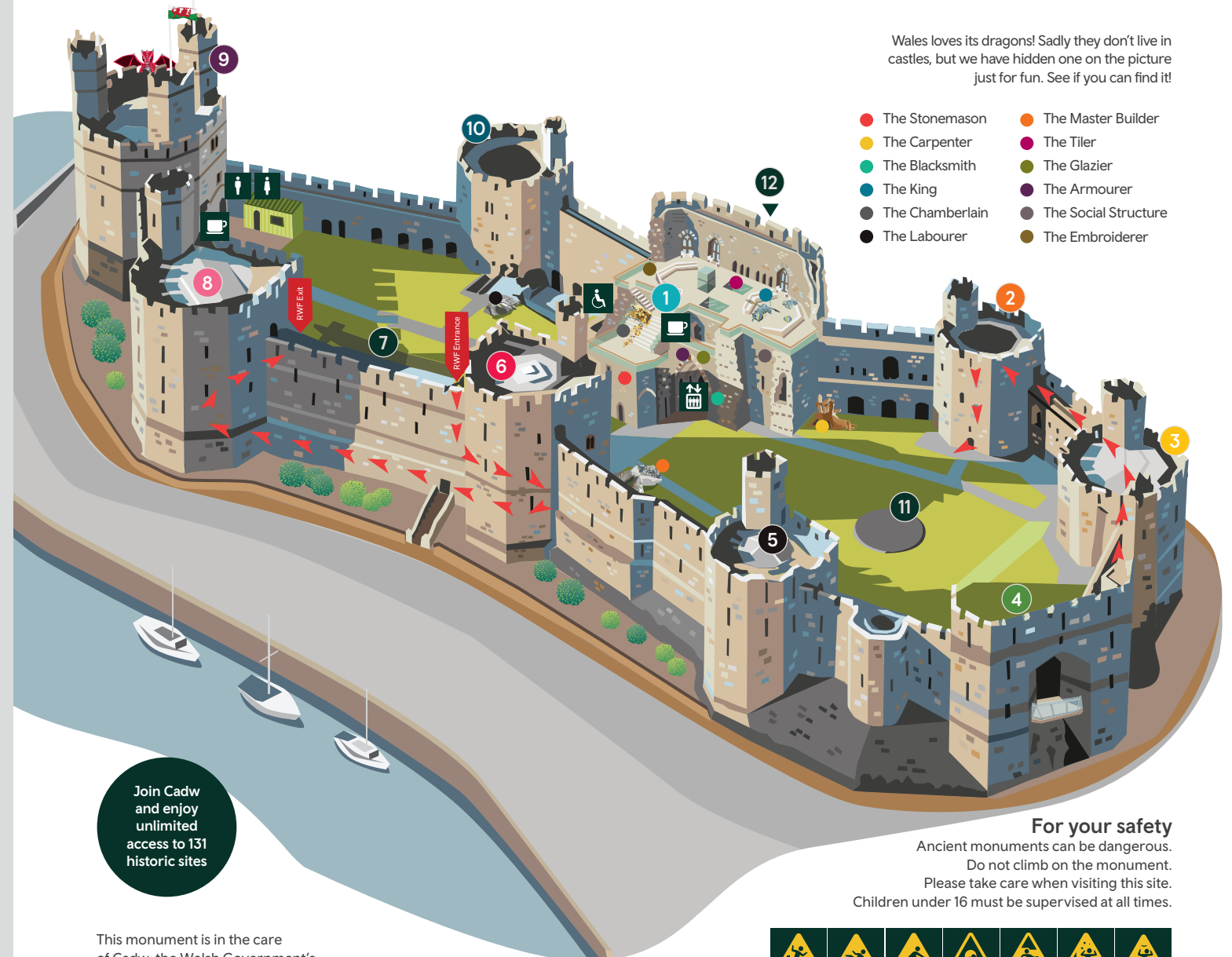


## What to see at Castell Caernarfon

- 1 Discover the hands that helped make the castle as you explore the **King's Gate**. This colossal twin-towered Gatehouse with its drawbridge, five doors, six portcullises, murder holes and arrowloops is a masterclass in defence.
- 2 Explore the octagonal **Granary Tower** with its ground floor well. Watch out for all the arrowloops outside — almost like a medieval machine gun!
- 3 Immerse yourself in the story of Castell Caernarfon, told through light and sound in the **North-East Tower**. Follow the arrows.
- 4 Gaze upon the **Queen's Gate**. Although never completed it still sits high above the Maes (Castle Square).
- 5 Wonder at the myths and legends of Caernarfon as told in the **Black Tower**.
- 6 Smoke out the **Chamberlain Tower** from the second floor, with the only surviving chimney in the castle.
- 7 Imagine the splendour of the **Great Hall**. Once the heart of the castle, now only its foundations remain.
- 8 Quick march to the **Queen's Tower**, home to the regimental museum of the Royal Welch Fusiliers, Wales' oldest infantry regiment. Follow the arrows.
- 9 Marvel at the mightiest tower of all, the splendid three-turreted **Eagle Tower**.
- 10 Plumb new depths in the **Well Tower** where you'll still find remains of medieval plumbing and a 50ft (15m) deep well.
- 11 Invest some time exploring the **Investiture Dais** — a disc of Welsh slate marks the site of the 1969 investiture of the Prince of Wales.
- 12 Entrance and shop.
