

- 1 Gain entry to the Inner Ward through this grand gatehouse, remodelled by Sir John Perrot to form a fitting entrance to his Tudor mansion.
- 2 Spot the many 'home improvements' made to the Great Hall during the relatively peaceful Tudor times. Just look at those huge windows for a start.
- 3 Rise above it all and climb the North-West Tower. Its unusual stone roof is a definite high point. Behold the brilliant views from the battlements!
- 4 Find our very own well. This supplied fresh water, handy at the best of times, but essential when the castle was under siege.
- 5 Get inspired in the Gazebo, just like Dylan Thomas did! This is where he wrote his wonderful short stories, *Portrait of the Artist as a Young Dog*.
- 6 Spare some time to seek out the sundial — and get treated to terrific views over the estuary.
- 7 Relax in our restored Victorian landscaped garden. In medieval times this was a full-on fighting zone.
- 8 Entrance/shop.
